On Monday 20 October at 1530hrs Detective Sergeant Dan Lovell will give an insight into the violence that follows two motorcycle clubs coming into conflict in communities. The presentation will focus not only on the immediate effects of conflicts but also explore the mindset of an Outlaw Motorcycle Gang when their dominance is challenged, their approach to law enforcement, even when victims of crime, and the nuances faced when investigating OMCG violence.

Detective Sergeant Lovell is an accomplished homicide investigator of 10 years and brings an intimate knowledge of a challenging investigation of an unusual crime.



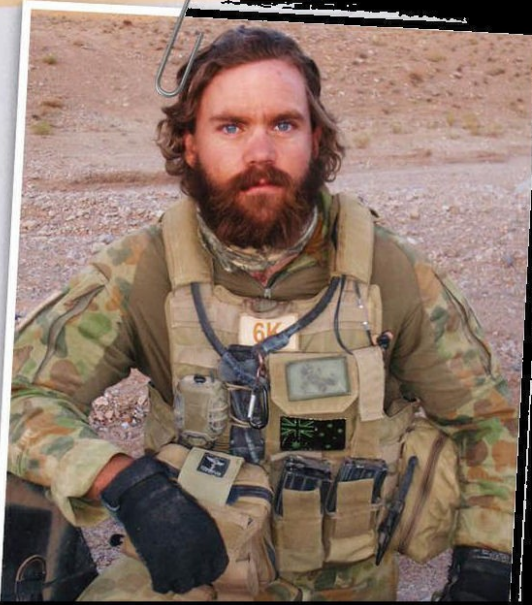

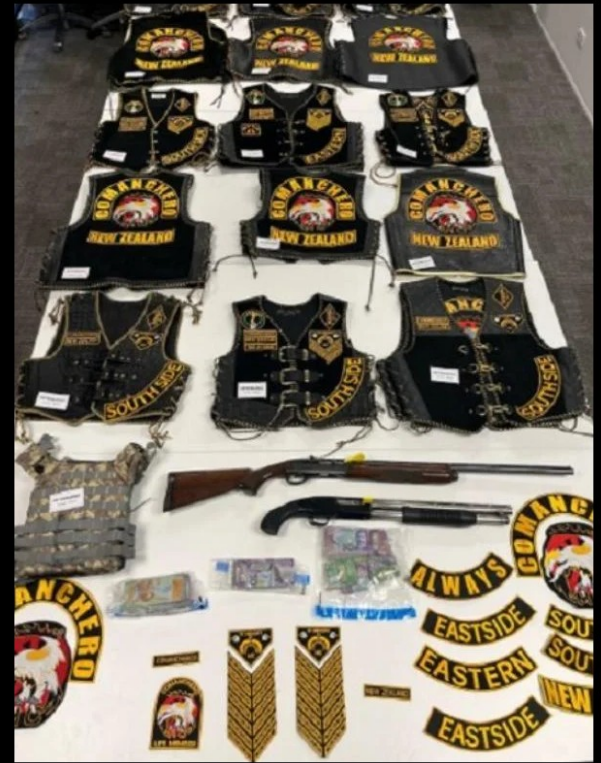

IN THE LAND OF THE LONG WHITE CLOUD

From their early emergence into New Zealand society in 2016, the Comanchero MC's power and influence within the criminal underworld grew exponentially. Their significant profile demanded an appropriate law enforcement response which resulted in 90% of the gang's hierarchy going to prison.



Detective Senior Sergeant Reece Sirl will be presenting on New Zealand Police's approach to combatting the establishment and rise of the Comanchero OMCG and the consequential changes to the criminal landscape. The presentation will include a case study on a Comanchero cash wage money laundering system and the significant effect it had on the Construction sector in New Zealand.



Detective Senior Sergeant Sirl has been in the New Zealand Police for 33 years with a background in covert and overt policing of Transnational Organised Crime. He has been working for the past six years as a Taskforce Operations Manager in the National Organised Crime Group.

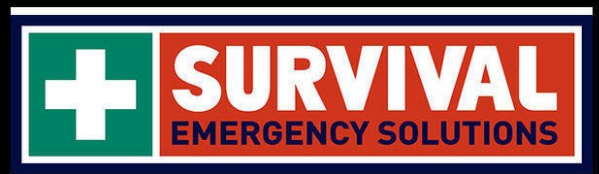
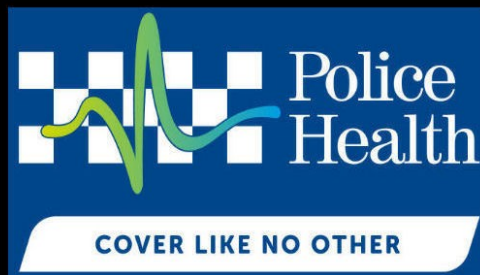
